MINUTES OF PUBLIC MEETING

Speech-Language Pathology, Audiology & Hearing Aid Dispensing Board

October 20, 2021

Call to Order, Confirmation of Quorum

Tami Brancamp, Board Chair, called the meeting to order at 4:32pm. A roll call confirmed a quorum was present.

Public Comment

There was no public comment.

Approval of the Minutes: Board Meeting of July 21, 2021

Tami Brancamp asked if there were any corrections or revisions to the minutes of the meeting of July 21, 2021 and none were noted. Tami Brancamp asked for a motion. Andrea Menicucci made a motion to approve the minutes of July 21, 2021 as written and Bonnie Lamping seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Welcome & Introduction of New Board Member, Lynee Anderson, HAS, Appointed 7/2/2021 to 7/1/2024

Ms. Pierce introduced Ms. Lynee Anderson, BC-HIS who was appointed to the Board to fill Tom Rainford's Hearing Aid Specialist seat. The Board welcomed Ms. Anderson.

Report Out and Recommendations for Action from Advisory Committee on Fitting and Dispensing Hearing Aids Meeting of August 11, 2021

Ms. Pierce shared that the Committee met on August 11, 2021 and made the following recommendations for the Board's consideration.

a. Discussion of Cerumen Management (Earwax Removal) by Hearing Aid Specialists
 Ms. Pierce summarized that neither this Board's NRS or NAC specifically allow or prohibit cerumen management by Hearing Aid Specialists, nor is it included in the NRS definitions of a Hearing Aid

Specialist. This issue has been raised somewhat frequently as the Board Office receives requests for guidance and reviews related complaints, and recent, similar legislation proposed in Tennessee would allow a Hearing Aid Specialist to engage in cerumen management in the course of fitting hearing aids, provided they complete an approved cerumen management course. The Committee voted unanimously to recommend the Board add revisions to NRS and/or NAC to address cerumen management, including required training, performed by Hearing Aid Specialists as a future legislative priority.

Tami Brancamp asked for discussion/questions on this item. Lynee Anderson provided background information on the potential risks of cerumen management performed by Hearing Aid Specialists without proper education, training, and medical resources. Tami Brancamp noted that both of the Board's Dispensing Audiologists were not present in this meeting to provide additional feedback, and it was agreed that the item would be tabled for the Board's next meeting when both could be present.

b. Update and Discussion on FDA Approval of Over the Counter Hearing Aids

Ms. Pierce reported that FDA Reauthorization Act of 2017 directed the FDA to develop regulations that would make Over the Counter (OTC) hearing aids available to the public by 2020. The process was delayed due to COVID-19, but the FDA now plans to address the issue during the current rulemaking session. It is expected that new regulations will be published in 2022, at which time OTC hearing aids are expected to become available to the public. President Biden also signed an Executive Order on July 9, 2021, that included a directive to the Department of Health and Human Services to consider issuing proposed rules within 120 days for allowing hearing aids to be sold over the counter. The Committee surmised that support at the federal level, as evidenced by the Executive Order, will likely ensure the regulations pass, despite objections and caution that patients should still seek care from qualified hearing professionals. The Committee was provided with related position statements issued by several prominent organizations and voted unanimously to recommend the Board issue a position statement on the matter with a reference to the *Joint Statement on Consumer-Administered Hearing Tests and Direct-to-Consumer Hearing Aid Sales* issued by ADA, AAA, AAOHNS, and ASHA, provided to the Board for this meeting.

Tami Brancamp asked for discussion/questions on this item. Lynee Anderson provided background information on OTC hearing aids and the risks of consumers purchasing them without consulting with a hearing professional. As with the last agenda item, Ms. Brancamp noted that both of the Board's Dispensing Audiologists were not present in this meeting to provide additional feedback, and it was agreed that the item would be tabled for the Board's next meeting when both could be present.

Work Session to Review and Approve Proposed Revisions to NAC 637B.400 Licensee Continuing Education Requirements for Administrative Rulemaking During 2021-2022 Interim

Ms. Pierce summarized the Board's work to date on this item, including a vote during the Board's July 2021 meeting to draft revised language in NAC 637B.400 to lower the annual CE requirement to ten (10) hours and align with relevant certification requirements. Ms. Pierce directed the Board to the draft document with the proposed changes made to the NAC language and explained that, should the Board vote to approve moving forward, the draft would be sent to the Legislative Counsel Bureau (LCB) for formal drafting and scheduled for a Public Workshop during the next Board meeting in January 2022. Ms. Pierce also noted an error on the first line of item 1(c) that should read "of the 10 hours of

continuing education must directly relate to the practice of fitting and dispensing hearing aids" instead of "15" and stated that she would make the correction before sending to LCB.

Tami Brancamp called for a motion. Bonnie Lamping made a motion to approve the draft with the needed correction and send to LCB with the intent to hold a Public Workshop in January 2022. Andrea Menicucci seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Work Session on Implementation of Licensee Jurisprudence Exam

Ms. Pierce summarized the Board's work to date on this item and directed the Board to the drafted exam questions for review and discussion and explained the exam's design, based on the NRS and NAC, with a set of 20 general/ethics questions for all licensees, and five specific questions for each license type. Ms. Pierce explained the plan to implement the exam as optional for all new applicants and renewals beginning January 2022, in an "open book" format, 100% score required, and unlimited attempts allowed. Board staff would then monitor the exam during 2022 with a tentative plan to begin requiring the exam for all new applicants and renewals in January 2023, using the same format, though the Board has not yet decided on a frequency to require the exam for renewals. It was agreed that there was not a need during this meeting to review each question and Board members agreed that the drafted questions appeared sufficient.

Tami Brancamp asked for a motion. Timothy Hunsaker made a motion to approve the exam draft and implement as optional in 2022 as planned. Lynee Anderson seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Following the vote, Andrea Menicucci asked a follow up question regarding whether many of the exam questions contained too many answer options. There was discussion about best practices in question design, and whether a multiple-choice question could be effective with too many (i.e. 6-8) answer choices, and whether work should be done to edit the questions. Ms. Pierce indicated that she could edit the questions, and it was agreed that the draft did not need to come back to the Board for approval, but the Board would need to formally delegate the work to Ms. Pierce. Henna Rasul, Board Counsel, advised that as the Board had just taken a vote, another vote would need to be taken to revoke the prior action, and then a new vote to delegate responsibility for the exam to Ms. Pierce.

Tami Brancamp asked for a motion. Timothy Hunsaker made a motion to revoke the prior action approving the exam draft and implementation plan. Lynee Anderson seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Tami Brancamp then asked for a motion on the new plan. Andrea Menicucci made a motion to delegate responsibility for editing, finalizing, and implementing the exam to the Executive Director, Ms. Pierce. Bonnie Lamping seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Work Session on Future Legislative Efforts (Standing Agenda Item):

a. Consideration to Revise NRS 637B to Add Licensing of Speech-Language Pathology Assistants
At the Board's January 20, 2021 meeting it was decided that this matter would be included as a
standing agenda item but tabled for the foreseeable future, based on concurrent work between
NSHA and the Nevada Department of Education (NDE) to "sunset" Bachelor's level SLP providers in
school settings. Kim Reddig, NSHA President was present in this meeting and provided an update,
sharing that a meeting was held recently between NSHA and NDE to continue the conversation
around raising the requirement to the Master's level, but no changes are imminent. NSHA is also

currently reviewing both NRS and NAC regarding speech-language practitioners to assess when and how proposed changes may need to be made and will continue to keep the Board apprised. No action was taken.

b. Work Session on Future Legislative Efforts to Consider Licensing Audiology Assistants

At the Board's April 21, 2021 meeting it was decided that this matter would be included as a standing agenda item in future meetings but tabled for the foreseeable future, with potential legislative efforts on this issue aligned with consideration for licensing SLP Assistants. No updates were provided, and no action was taken.

c. Consideration to Revise NRS 637B to Address Telehealth and Telesupervision

At the Board's July 21, 2021 meeting it was decided that this matter would be included as a standing agenda item in future meetings. No updates were provided, and no action was taken.

Disciplinary Matters: Cases Recommendation for Dismissal

a. Case No. A21-03

Ms. Pierce summarized that the Complaint alleged violation of federal and state law and/or regulations relating to the fitting and dispensing of hearing aids, and unprofessional conduct. After investigation and review of all documentation received on this complaint, it was determined that there is insufficient evidence to file a formal complaint for hearing before the Board and the facts set forth in the accusations are insufficient to establish a violation of Chapter 637B of the Nevada Revised Statutes or the Nevada Administrative Code. This case is recommended for dismissal.

Tami Brancamp called for a motion. Andrea Menicucci made a motion to dismiss the case as recommended. Timothy Hunsaker seconded the motion. The motion passed.

b. Case No. H21-02

Ms. Pierce summarized that the Complaint alleged violation of federal and state law and/or regulations relating to the practice of a Hearing Aid Specialist, delegation of duties to an unlicensed office assistant outside of those allowed by NAC 637B.0442, and unprofessional conduct. After investigation and review of all documentation received on this complaint, it was determined that there is insufficient evidence to file a formal complaint for hearing before the Board and the facts set forth in the accusations are insufficient to establish a violation of Chapter 637B of the Nevada Revised Statutes or the Nevada Administrative Code. This case is recommended for dismissal.

Tami Brancamp called for a motion. Andrea Menicucci made a motion to dismiss the case as recommended. Minnie Foxx seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Executive Director's Report

Ms. Pierce directed the Board to the written Executive Director's Report and summarized as follows:

a. Licensure Statistics

Ms. Pierce reported that the end of FY22 Q1 resulted in a net increase of 22 licenses, a 2% increase from the prior quarter. This is a small decrease but fairly consistent from this same quarter last year (FY21 Q1) where we saw a 3% increase with a total of 94 licenses issued, compared to 88 this past quarter.

b. FY22 Q1 Financial Report

The FY22 Q1 Financial Summary resulted in income and expenses that are commensurate with first-quarter estimates, with income slightly higher than projected. Total revenue was \$49.097.75 (32.74% of budget), and expenses were \$35,796.56 (23.58% of budget), resulting in net income of \$13,307.94. Total Equity (reserves) are \$87,212.85 at the end of Q1, which has increased \$11,964.36 from FY21 Q4. There were no major deviations from the budget in expenses, however income from both license fees and exams are higher than projected at 28.04% and 33.68% respectively and may even out as the year progresses.

c. Recognition of Tami Brancamp's Appointment as Interim Chair at UNR School of Medicine, Department of Speech Pathology and Audiology

Ms. Pierce announced Tami Brancamp's appointment as the Interim Chair at UNR School of Medicine, Department of Speech Pathology and Audiology on August 11, 2021. Board members and staff acknowledged and congratulated Dr. Brancamp on this achievement.

d. Board Member Appointments/Reappointments

Ms. Pierce summarized Board changes, including the previously announced appointment of Lynee Anderson to the HAS seat vacated by Tom Rainford in July 2021. Ms. Anderson will also sit on the Advisory Committee for Fitting and Dispensing Hearing Aids. Andrea Menicucci was also reappointed to 7/1/2024, resulting in a full Board. The next appointments to expire are Timothy Hunsaker (eligible for reappointment) and Bonnie Lamping (terming out/not eligible for reappointment) in July 2022.

e. Complaints

Ms. Pierce reported that following the July 2021 meeting, there were three (3) complaint cases open for investigation. Two (2) cases were presented and approved for dismissal at this meeting, leaving one (1) open case. Ms. Pierce verbally corrected the written report which stated one (1) complaint was received in October 2021, when in fact that complaint included two practitioners, and further reported that another complaint was received earlier today, leaving four (4) open complaint cases.

Executive Director Annual Evaluation

Tami Brancamp introduced this item, and the Board was directed to the performance evaluation form they had been asked to review and score prior to the meeting. Ms. Pierce also provided a summary of her work during the period between September 2020 and September 2021. The Board Chair and members discussed each item and provided their individual scores in each area. Tami Brancamp will total and finalize the evaluation scores following the meeting. The Board was complimentary of Ms. Pierce's work and thanked her for her efforts. There was additional discussion around the Executive Director's compensation and whether staff salary increases could be considered. Given budgetary constraints, staff have not received any salary increase in the last two fiscal years, and Ms. Brancamp suggested an agenda item for January 2022 to review the Board's budget and propose staff salary or cost-of-living increases for FY23.

Report from Legal Counsel

Henna Rasul, Board Counsel had no new information to report on legal matters. She also shared that she supports the Board's findings and recommendations for the Executive Director's Evaluation.

PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE

SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGY, AUDIOLOGY AND

HEARING AID DISPENSING BOARD

LCB File No. R064-21

November 15, 2021

EXPLANATION - Matter in italics is new; matter in brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AUTHORITY: § 1, NRS 637B.132 and 637B.191.

A REGULATION relating to professional licensing; revising continuing education requirements for the renewal of a license to practice speech-language pathology, audiology or the fitting and dispensing of hearing aids; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law requires the Speech-Language Pathology, Audiology and Hearing Aid Dispensing Board to adopt regulations prescribing requirements for the renewal of a license or endorsement issued by the Board. (NRS 637B.191) With certain exceptions, existing regulations require a licensee to complete 15 hours of continuing education as a prerequisite for the renewal of a standard license or provisional license. (NAC 637B.400) This regulation: (1) reduces, from 15 hours to 10 hours, the total number of hours of continuing education required for the renewal of a license; and (2) requires at least 1 of these hours to relate to ethics. If a licensee is a dispensing audiologist, existing regulations require at least 5 hours of continuing education to relate directly to the practice of fitting and dispensing hearing aids. (NAC 637B.400) This regulation reduces the requirement from 5 hours to 3 hours.

Section 1. NAC 637B.400 is hereby amended to read as follows:

637B.400 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2 of NAC 637B.403 and NAC 637B.430, as a prerequisite for each renewal of a standard license or provisional license, a licensee must complete, during the annual period immediately preceding the renewal, at least [15] 10 hours of continuing education approved by the Board that directly pertains to the profession in which he or she holds a license issued by the Board [1], including at least 1 hour

of continuing education relating to ethics. If the licensee is a dispensing audiologist, at least [5] 3 of the [15] 10 hours of continuing education must directly relate to the practice of fitting and dispensing hearing aids.

- 2. Legible copies of all receipts, records of attendance, certificates and any other evidence of a licensee's completion of a course of continuing education must be retained by the licensee and made available to the Board for inspection for not less than 3 years after the completion of the course.
- 3. The Board will conduct random audits of licensees to ensure compliance with the requirements of this section.
- 4. If a licensee completes more than the required number of hours of continuing education during one licensing period, the licensee is not allowed to credit the excess hours toward the required education for a subsequent period.
- 5. For the purposes of subsection 1, a course approved by the International Institute for Hearing Instruments Studies of the International Hearing Society, American Academy of Audiology, American Speech-Language-Hearing Association, Academy of Doctors of Audiology or Educational Audiology Association is deemed to be approved by the Board.

Hello:

I sincerely appreciate the effort to amend this continuing education to align with ASHA requirements. Most particularly, I am in support of reducing the annual continuing education from the current 15 hours to the 10 hours (which is the ASHA requirement). Reasons for support:

- 1. Aligns with national accreditation requirements.
- 2. Helps the NV Speech-Language Pathologists and Audiologists reduce costs.

However, as of Jan 1, 2020, ASHA requires 1 hour out of the 30 hours (in 3 year period) to be in the area of ethics, and as of Jan 1, 2023, ASHA is making a change to continuing education and will be requiring 2 of the 30 hours (in 3 year period) to be in areas of "cultural competency, cultural humility, culturally responsive practice, or diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI)" (https://www.asha.org/certification/maintain-ccc/)

How could Nevada continue to remain closer to ASHA changes, and support training for quality of service the SLPs provide? We seem to be behind the national goals. The upcoming ASHA change reflects improving cultural competency and responsiveness, which is critical to our service delivery. So if we are going to make a change, why not address these areas as well?

May I suggest that instead of the proposed:

Section 1. NAC 637B.400 is hereby amended to read as follows:

637B.400 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2 of NAC 637B.403 and NAC 637B.430, as a prerequisite for each renewal of a standard license or provisional license, a licensee must complete, during the annual period immediately preceding the renewal, at least [15] 10 hours of continuing education approved by the Board that directly pertains to the profession in which he or she holds a license issued by the Board [.], including at least 1 hour of continuing education relating to ethics.

That we consider the following proposal:

Section 1. NAC 637B.400 is hereby amended to read as follows:

637B.400 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2 of NAC 637B.403 and NAC 637B.430, as a prerequisite for each renewal of a standard license or provisional license, a licensee must complete, during the annual period immediately preceding the renewal, at least [15] 10 hours of continuing education approved by the Board that directly pertains to the profession in which he or she holds a license issued by the Board [.], including at least 1 hour --2-- LCB Draft of Proposed Regulation R064-21

of continuing education relating to ethics OR in areas of cultural competency, cultural humility, culturally responsive practice, or diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI). In addition, 1 hour of ethics must be obtained every 3 years.

The dark *green italicized* is my suggested change.



Report Out and Recommendations for Action from Advisory Committee on Fitting and Dispensing Hearing Aids Meeting of August 11, 2021

The Committee met on August 11, 2021 and the items listed below were discussed, resulting in two (2) recommendations brought before the Board today:

Items Discussed with RECOMMENDATION to the Board:

a. Discussion of Cerumen Management (Earwax Removal) by Hearing Aid Specialists Attachment(s): None

Neither this Board's NRS or NAC specifically allow or prohibit cerumen management by Hearing Aid Specialists, nor is it included in the NRS definitions of a Hearing Aid Specialist. This issue has been raised somewhat frequently as the Board Office receives requests for guidance and reviews related complaints.

The item was presented to the Committee to consider a recommendation for the Board to consider this as a potential NRS revisions in a future legislative session to clarify this practice. Recent, similar legislation proposed in Tennessee would allow a Hearing Aid Specialist to engage in cerumen management in the course of fitting hearing aids provided they complete an approved cerumen management course.


The Committee voted unanimously to recommend the Board add the following as a future legislative priority: revisions to NRS and/or NAC to address cerumen management, including required training, performed by Hearing Aid Specialists.

b. Update and Discussion on FDA Approval of Over-the-Counter Hearing Aids Attachment(s): Joint Statement on OTC Hearing Aids

The FDA Reauthorization Act of 2017 directed the FDA to develop regulations that would make Over-

the-Counter (OTC) hearing aids available to the public by 2020. This process was delayed due to the COVID-19 pandemic, but the FDA now plans to address the issue during the current rulemaking session. It is expected that new regulations will be published in 2022, at which time OTC hearing aids are expected to become available to the public. President Biden also signed an Executive Order on July 9, 2021, that included a directive to the Department of Health and Human Services to consider issuing proposed rules within 120 days for allowing hearing aids to be sold over the counter.

The Committee surmised that support at the federal level, as evidenced by the Executive Order, will likely ensure the regulations pass, despite objections and caution that patients should still seek care from qualified hearing professionals. The Committee was provided with related position statements issued by several prominent organizations.



The Committee voted unanimously to recommend the Board issue a position statement on the matter with a reference to the *Joint Statement on Consumer-Administered Hearing Tests and Direct-to-Consumer Hearing Aid Sales* issued by ADA, AAA, AAOHNS, and ASHA.

Since the original recommendation in August 2021, the, the FDA released Proposed rules for Over the Counter Hearing Aids and Draft Guidance "Regulatory Requirements for Hearing Aid Devices and Personal Sound Amplification Products.", on October 20, 2021 with public comments due on each by January 18, 2022, 11:59pm ET. While the timing would not allow Board approval of public comments for submission, the matter was brought back before the Committee for an update at its January 12, 2022 meeting, where it was agreed to affirm the earlier recommendation for the Board to adopt the joint statement.

Revisions to NRS 637B Related to NBC-HIS Certification for HAS License

Attachment(s): None

This item was originally presented for the Committee's review in the August 11, 2021 meeting as there have been a handful of recent HAS Apprentices whose licenses have expired and as a result, were unable to continue pursuit of a Standard HAS License per NRS 637B.238, which limits the apprenticeship to three years. NBC-HIS exam candidates must hold a current state license in addition to other requirements to be eligible to sit for the exam. Once the Apprentice license expires, the candidate is no longer eligible to apply to sit for the exam, even if they have completed the apprenticeship and passed the written ILE exam. The requirement for NBC-HIS certification for HAS licensure is located in NRS 637B.193(2): "An applicant for a license to engage in the practice of fitting and dispensing hearing aids must: 2. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 637B.201, be certified by the National Board for Certification in Hearing Instrument Sciences."

This certification is a requirement in Nevada for both the HAS Standard and Temporary licenses and we were aware that Nevada was reportedly one of only a few states that requires it. We confirmed via email from Mary Stone, NBC-HIS Certification Coordinator, on September 9, 2021 that we are only one of two states with this requirement: "Utah is the only state that requires Board Certification in Hearing Instrument Sciences (BC-HIS) for initial licensure, outside of the nuanced Nevada law. IHS does not support using Board Certification as the entry level examination/credential, as it is meant to be an optional pursuit for the advanced hearing aid dispensing professional. IHS would be happy to engage with the Nevada board about modifying their standard to bring it in line with national standards for licensure."

The Committee voted unanimously to recommend the Board add the following as a future legislative priority: revisions to NRS and/or NAC regarding NBC-HIS requirement for HAS applicants.

Joint Statement on Consumer-Administered Hearing Tests and Direct-to-Consumer Hearing Aid Sales

The Academy of Doctors of Audiology (ADA), American Academy of Audiology (AAA), American Academy of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery (AAO-HNS), the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association (ASHA), and International Hearing Society (IHS) stand together, committed to increasing awareness of the benefits of amplification, and to finding safe and effective solutions that help the 75% of consumers who could benefit from hearing aids but cannot afford to purchase them or have chosen not to use them.

While we appreciate the desire of persons, companies, and organizations to reach more individuals in need of hearing aids, our organizations believe that patients must have access to a comprehensive hearing evaluation performed by a hearing health professional, be appropriately fitted by an individual licensed/registered in the state to dispense hearing aids, and have access to auditory rehabilitation and counseling to ensure appropriate fit and use of the hearing aid device. We urge all persons, companies, and organizations who are interested in assisting patients to work with the hearing health community in ensuring that patients have access to the professional services of all qualified hearing health professionals.

Federal and state laws related to the dispensing of a hearing aid are currently in place to protect and ensure consumer safety. Regulations issued by the Food and Drug Administration require that patients under the age of 18 receive a medical evaluation by a licensed physician prior to the purchasing of a hearing aid from a dispenser. A medical evaluation by a licensed physician is also recommended for adults prior to a hearing aid purchase. Many state laws also recognize the importance of consumer protection and safety by placing restrictions on the dispensing of hearing aids by direct mail and/or the internet.

All of our organizations have both health and efficacy concerns about the use of consumer-administered hearing tests and the direct sale of hearing aids to the consumer without the involvement of a licensed hearing health professional — an audiologist, hearing aid specialist, or otolaryngologist. We encourage our respective members and other hearing health care providers to work collaboratively to ensure patient safety and enhance consumer protections related to the purchase of hearing aids and related devices.

a. Case No. S21-02

The Complaint alleged violation of federal and state law and/or regulations relating to supervision and unprofessional conduct.

After investigation and review of all documentation received on this complaint, it has been determined that there is insufficient evidence to file a formal complaint for hearing before the Board and the facts set forth in the accusations are insufficient to establish a violation of Chapter 637B of the Nevada Revised Statutes or the Nevada Administrative Code.

This case is recommended for dismissal.

b. Case No. S21-03

The Complaint alleged violation of federal and state law and/or regulations relating to scope of practice and unprofessional conduct.

After investigation and review of all documentation received on this complaint, it has been determined that there is insufficient evidence to file a formal complaint for hearing before the Board and the facts set forth in the accusations are insufficient to establish a violation of Chapter 637B of the Nevada Revised Statutes or the Nevada Administrative Code.

This case is recommended for dismissal.

c. Case No. S21-04

The complaint alleged unprofessional conduct.

After investigation and review of all documentation received on this complaint, it has been determined that there is insufficient evidence to file a formal complaint for hearing before the Board and the facts set forth in the accusations are insufficient to establish a violation of Chapter 637B of the Nevada Revised Statutes or the Nevada Administrative Code.

This case is recommended for dismissal.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

January 19, 2022

a. Licensure Statistics

The following chart provides licensing statistics for the period October 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021 with a net increase of just 2 licenses, a less-than-1% increase from the prior quarter. This is a decrease from the 2% increase we saw in this same quarter last year (FY20 Q2), when we notably had roughly the same number of new licenses issued (42 vs 47), but many more licenses expired (40 vs 18). As over half of our licenses expire on 12/31, this is our largest renewal quarter, though only 35 December licenses remain eligible for late renewal (as of 1/3/2022).

b. FY22 Q2 Financial Report & FY21 Balance Sheet

The FY22 Q1 Financial Summary is attached for the Board's Review. Income and expenses are both slightly lower than projected in the budget. It is hoped that expenses will continue to stay low, and income will increase if trends continue toward an influx in new applications at the end of the academic year.

There were no major deviations from the budget in expenses, though legal fees are lower than normal due to anticipation of an overdue invoice from the Attorney General's office due to a billing system change, but the total should fall within expected range. It should be noted that we have paid the annual license fee for the database and the expense will be spread over the course of the year.

FY21 Balance Sheet

Also enclosed is a copy of the FY21 Balance Sheet submitted to the Legislative Counsel Bureau on November 18, 2021, pursuant to NRS 218G.400. This law requires that Boards be audited annually or biennially by a certified public accountant or public accountant, unless the revenue of the board from all sources is less than \$200,000 for any fiscal year, in which case a balance sheet must be prepared and submitted in lieu of an audit.

c. Update on Implementation of Optional Licensee Jurisprudence Exam

The optional jurisprudence exams have been finalized in Google forms, which will capture exam attempts and allow us to analyze results over the next year. This is a free method, and the Board may want to consider purchasing integration through the database/website once the exams become required. A new informational page has been added to the Board website at https://www.nvspeechhearing.org/about/laws-regs/jpexam.asp which explaining the exams and provides a link to the licensee-specific exams. Language has also been added to the new application and renewal pages directing practitioners to test their knowledge.

d. Complaints and Updated Complaint Forms

Following the October 2021 meeting, there were four complaint cases open for investigation. Two new complaints have since been received, totaling six. Two cases were presented in this meeting for dismissal, and if approved, will leave **four** open cases.

A recent review of our complaint process identified a need to clearly differentiate between a complaint (which can only be made against a Board licensee), and a report of unlicensed practice, which can be made against any person allegedly engaging in practice without a license.

The Board only has jurisdiction to take disciplinary action against a licensee. Board response to unlicensed practice is considered administrative action, as the Board's jurisdiction is over the subject matter/practice, and the NRS/NAC rules for how each are handled are different.

As a result, we have revised our website language regarding complaints and created a new webpage specific to unlicensed practice, so that the public/consumers may better understand these processes and report appropriately. To support this, we have also revised the complaint form and created a new form to report unlicensed practice. Both are presented today for the Board's review and approval. These forms, along with the new website language have been reviewed and approved by Board Counsel.

Our Board's revenue from all sources in FY21 was under \$200,000. As such, please find enclosed the requested Balance Sheet with supporting documentation for Fiscal Year 2021 ending June 30, 2021 pursuant to the provisions of NRS 218G.400.

We also had two new members appointed to the Board since our last submission and I have included a current Board Roster.

FY21 Financial Summary

The Board ended FY21 unexpectedly over budget by approximately \$12,000, compared to the initial estimate of a \$28,000+ deficit. This is likely a result of significant cost-savings measures implemented this year, a conservative estimation of revenue when the FY21 budget was developed, and a notable increase in new licenses this year/quarter. This is a particularly encouraging trend given the failure of our fee increase bill in the recent legislative session, and it is anticipated that continued fiscal responsibility will support the Board in rebuilding its financial reserves.

Deviations from Budget

- <u>Legal/investigative fees</u> were (not unexpectedly) beyond budget at 168.25% given the number of complaints received in FY21 (8) and one (1) prior case that resulted in multiple hearings. This was adjusted for FY22.
- <u>Membership dues</u> were over budget due to an omission of one membership in development of the FY21 budget, which has been corrected for FY22.
- <u>Personnel costs, licensing program subscription, office supplies, printing, and postage</u> were slightly over budget, and was adjusted for FY22.

Review of FY22 Budget to Consider and Approve Board Staff COLA/Merit Raises

During the October 21, 2021 meeting, the Board conducted a performance review of the Executive Director, and it was suggested that an agenda item should be added to the next meeting to consider COLA/merit raises for Board staff. The following compensation changes are proposed, with a revised FY22 budget attached to demonstrate the difference. It should be noted that the approved FY22 budget included a calculation error totaling personnel costs at \$114,000, though the actual budgeted line items only total \$108,476, thus the proposed raises only increase approved budgeted costs by less than \$2,000.

- 1. A 6% COLA increase for the Executive Director and Licensing Coordinator, effective immediately. This would take effect on the next pay date (2/3/2022) and cover the remaining 11 pay periods for FY22 at an increase of \$5,631.12 to the FY22 budget. The cost of additional PTO liability to reserves is negligible (<\$600 annually) and only a factor if a staff member resigns and PTO is paid out). This percentage is prosed based on recent, significant increases in inflation and aligns with a federal COLA increase of 5.9% taking effect in 2022. (No current information was found regarding planned State of Nevada COLA increases). A review of pay grade and compensation rates for similar state positions confirms that these new annual salary totals are commensurate with comparable positions and appropriate and are prorated to reflect the part-time hours provided the Board by both staff.
- 2. A one-time merit bonus to the Executive Director in the amount of \$3,000 to reflect two years of service with excellent performance reviews and no increases since her hire in 2019. The payment is proposed as a bonus (equivalent to 2.5% of salary for each year of service), rather than a salary increase to limit this cost to the current fiscal year. This will allow future increases/bonuses to be considered in the context of the Board's current financial position at that time.

As discussed earlier in the review of the Board's Q2 financials, revenue and expenses are commensurate with projections and the Board's reserves have increased almost \$23,000 since this quarter last year. These numbers support a staff increase and parallel FY22 budget projections. Given the reserve total of over \$93,000 at the end of this past quarter, it is possible for the Board to continue towards a goal of holding one-year's operating costs. The impact of the COLA increase to future budgets totals \$6,219 annually, which is easily supported with continued fiscal responsibility.


